## The Area B Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community (PI/CPC) Coordinator

The Area B Public Information and Cooperation with the Professional Community (PI/CPC) Coordinator (PI Sub-Committee Chair) is AA's representative to the public and professional community in Area B. The primary purpose of PI/CPC activities is to provide information to the public and the professional community about how AA can collaboratively assist them to help the still suffering alcoholic achieve sobriety. The Area B PI/CPC Coordinator is a two-year service position and is a voting office.

The Area B PI/CPC Coordinator:

- Informs the Area B Committee and Fellowship on PI/CPC service work being conducted by individual Groups, Districts and Area B Sub-committees, throughout the Area, via Assembly and Committee meetings reports and notifications in the Area B-Line and website.
- Maintains a current calendar of PI/CPC events
- Maintains a portfolio of official contacts within industries (e.g. Health, Welfare, Legal, Defence, Religious and Education), and professionals, who support clients that may benefit by exposure to AA's recovery program
- Communicates PI/CPC activities and professional contact information to the National PI/CPC Coordinator.
- Chairs the PI/CPC Sub-committee
- Engages Area B membership participation in PI/CPC service work and Sub-Committee
- While not responsible for organising or attending PI/CPC events across Area, the role can be directly involved in this type of service through the Area B PI/CPC Sub-committee.

- Be familiar with a broad range of PI/CPC literature tools
- Demonstrate an understanding of the PI/CPC related guidelines (GL-07, GL-19 and GL-25) and principles of AA PI/CPC when engaging in PI/CPC service work.
- Assist AA Groups or members wishing to engage in local PI/CPC service work
- Is the custodian of Area's National PI/CPC kit and 2 x PI Banners which may be used by any Group in Area B engaging in PI/CPC events.
- Is accountable and prudent with any monies allocated from Area funds for PI/CPC service
- Attends the National PI/CPC Forums according to the Assembly's wishes and financial viability
- Demonstrates the necessary skills and personal qualities to effectively communicate and collaborate with agencies and professionals
- It suggested that the PI/CPC Coordinator have at least two years continuous sobriety
